The San Antonio, Texas University Sin Fronteras Campus will offer the 'Decolonize San Antonio and South Texas' Course...it will start from defining what is colonialism? What is Liberation? What constitutes a 'decolonizing' process towards LIBERATION! The four classes that make up the course for Liberation Spring semester is for young and old, will end in a collective summary-synthesize of what the course meant. The synthesize is collective.

The course will look at South Texas under the original peoples, the so-called doctrine of discovery, the Spanish invasion and occupation, colonialism and imperialism, plantations, capitalism, slavery and the emancipation struggle, the slave republic of Texas, and the invasion and occupation by the US troops, the expansionist war against Mexico, and the annexation by force on the northern territories of Mexico. The course will look critically at the role of culture in assimilation and resistance in the forms of *corridos* or ballads of South Texas and Northern Mexico.

Invited adjunct faculty will share the knowledge per class, with circular discussion for all to share in the discussion, analysis and debate during class and notes are taken for the record, and student participants write up a one page reflection paper on each class which becomes part of the archival data of the course as a whole. The summary or best yet, synthesize of the course is done collectively by the students-participants. All who complete the course receive a CERTIFICATE of COMPLETION for UNSIF.

(Historiography)**

**May 7 -Class V: Collective Synthesis(what did it all mean?) AND documented it.**

The goal of the Liberation Spring Semester is to support leadership through inter-generational and intra-generational methodologies in order to bridge the 'veteran' leaders and social movement organizers and the new young activists just getting started.

O for organization development, deepening, and enhancement,
